Eighth Grade School Supplies

Books are the property of the school and are on loan to the children for the school year. Parents will be required to pay for any books, including library books, which are lost or defaced. It is the responsibility of the student to keep a book cover on hardbound classroom textbooks that go home with a student. Books are to be carried to and from school in a book bag.

The annual registration fee is used to purchase textbooks, workbooks, testing materials and associated scoring costs, classroom magazines, and additional curricular and instructional items.

All items on the following list are to be furnished by the student's family. Students need to bring the following supplies with them on the first day of school. The teacher will notify the family when supplies are running low and need to be replaced.

Classroom

- A book bag - rolling or regular backpack styles
- A number of pencils - #2 lead pencils in the standard or automatic pencil styles
- Two (2) packages of washable markers
 - A set of 8 basic colors in the broad-tip style
 - A set of fine-tip style markers
- A box of crayons - 24 colors, thin style is preferred
- A box of colored pencils – If these are to be used in art class, the teacher has requested crayola-brand or art-store quality pencils. The other, less expensive brands break easily and do not work well in the pencil sharpeners.
- A dry-erase marker – any color
- A pair of scissors
- A glue stick
- A bottle of glue
- A pencil eraser
- A 12-inch metric ruler
- A protractor for Math
- A 2 “ white three-ring binder, used in Science in Grades 6, 7 & 8
- A set of colored dividers for Science
- A roll of paper towels for Science
- A three-ring binder & 25-30 page protectors used 2nd semester in writing
- A red ball-point pen or pencil
- A blue or black ball-point pen – permanent pens must be used for tests; erasable pens can be used for other work
- A Webster Collegiate Paperback Dictionary (Used in English, Grades 6, 7 & 8)
- A soft-side, zippered pencil case. Please do not purchase hard-side pencil cases. They do not fit in the desks. Large freezer bags can be used if desired.
- 6 book covers. If they don't stretch, you will need extra large size
- A large box of tissues
- Optional: A four function calculator

Paper

All paper must be wide-ruled. College-ruled or paper torn from spiral notebooks will not be accepted by the teachers. A separate package of wide-ruled loose-leaf is needed for Science binder.

Notebooks & Folders

Each student is expected to have five (5) one-subject, wide-ruled spiral notebooks and five (5) 2-pocket folders, one for each of the following subjects; Math, Science, Religion, English, Literature, and Computer. (It aids organization if student is color coded: i.e., Math – red folder and red spiral notebook.)

Social Studies

Each student needs a one (1) inch binder and loose-leaf college-ruled paper.

Spanish

- A two-pocket folder
- A wireless notebook – this type of notebook is not a spiral notebook or a composition book. It is designed to have pages that can easily be removed if needed without the hanging pieces of paper left from a spiral notebook.
- Loose leaf paper for homework
- A Spanish/English Dictionary - recommend Larousse or Vox
- Grammar Book - "Quick Study Academic Outline: Spanish Grammar " by Barchart
- One highlighter
- One personal dry erase board, markers and eraser

Art

The children in the upper grades are also expected to gather and bring all required art supplies to art class. They should create and keep a separate art bag.

- A kneaded art eraser
- A package of multi-colored sharpies which includes the color black
- Drawing pencils: 2H, 2B, 4B, B, 6B
- A sketch book of any size. The children may use the back pages to take class notes or they may bring a separate spiral notebook to take notes.
- Colored Pencils
- Ruler
- Pencil Sharpener
- Scissors
- Glue Stick
- White Glue
- Optional: A drawing compass

White-Out and felt tip pens may not be used in the classrooms. Permanent markers are also not acceptable in school except for Art Class.
